

## THAT'S WHAT BULLIES DO!

A Choral Speaking/Reading Script in Rhyme Written and Formatted by Lois Walker For Intermediate Readers

**ANTI-BULLYING PLEDGE:** This script was conceived and written as a way to involve student readers in a campaign to stamp out bullying. The "pledge" referred to in the script is an Anti-bullying Pledge that concerned students are asked to sign. **FORMATTING AND READER PARTS:** This script is formatted as a choral speaking/reading script for ALL, ALL GIRLS and ALL BOYS.

**ESTABLISHING THE RHYTHM:** To find the proper rhythm, first readaloud and clap through the piece as you go. Each underlined word or word part falls directly on a beat. As you read, clap on each underlined word, keeping the rhythm steady. Be careful not to read too fast! This is a rehearsal technique and readers will not clap throughout the entire piece during performance. **NOTE:** There are a number of times during the reading when readers are asked to clap and these are clearly indicated below.

Example: Clap, clap - clap/clap/clap (Count: one, two, 1/2/3).

**READING WITH EXPRESSION:** It's important to read with expression both vocally and physically. Use your voice, facial expressions, and gestures to give the reading energy and make it come alive for your audience. Keep up the pace and rhythm, but don't be afraid to slow down occasionally for dramatic effect. Above all, work as a team and practice the piece over and over until all readers are comfortable with their parts and able to anticipate what will happen next.

**AUDIENCE PARTICIPATION:** Older readers performing for younger students may wish to encourage their listeners to join in on the clapping and repetitive line: THAT'S WHAT BULLIES DO!

**VERSE 1** 

ALL: <u>Pushing</u>, pulling, <u>picking</u> on,

Hitting, holding, sitting on,

<u>Punching</u>, poking, <u>spit</u>ting on,

THAT'S WHAT BULLIES DO!

(Clap, clap - clap/clap/clap)

THAT'S WHAT BULLIES DO!

VERSE 2

ALL BOYS: And sometimes they invade your space,

And sometimes grab your pencil case,

And <u>leave</u> you feeling <u>out</u> of place.

ALL GIRLS: THAT'S WHAT BULLIES DO!

(Clap, clap - clap/clap/clap)

ALL: <u>THAT'S</u> WHAT BULLIES <u>DO!</u>

## **VERSE 3**

ALL GIRLS: <u>Making fun of, never pleasing,</u>

Taunting, laughing - ever teasing,

<u>Friend</u>ly talk, for<u>ever</u> freezing,

ALL BOYS: THAT'S WHAT BULLIES DO!

(<u>Clap</u>, clap - <u>clap</u>/clap/clap)

ALL: THAT'S WHAT BULLIES DO!

## **VERSE 4**

ALL GIRLS: And <u>some</u>times they in<u>sult</u> your race,

And sometimes rub it in your face,

ALL BOYS: And <u>leave</u> you feeling <u>in</u> disgrace.

ALL GIRLS: THAT'S WHAT BULLIES DO!

(<u>Clap</u>, clap - <u>clap</u>/clap/clap)

ALL: <u>THAT'S</u> WHAT BULLIES <u>DO!</u>

## **VERSE 5**

SOLO 1: <u>Name</u>-calling, <u>causing</u> stress,

SOLO 2: Excluding someone too, I guess.

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
