An Early Visit From Santa Claus

NOTE: This script is formatted for 17 SOLO READERS, ALL GIRLS, ALL BOYS, and ALL. One of the solo reading parts is the part of Santa. You might want to assign this part to an older student or a teacher. The script is very flexible and allows a director to use as few or as many readers as required by dividing the reading parts between all available readers. If the class is very small, double up on solo reader parts. If the class is very large, you can still include everyone by assigning all readers to the ALL GIRL, ALL BOY, ALL lines.

ESTABLISHING THE RHYTHM

To find the proper rhythm for this choral piece, first read-aloud and clap through the sections as you go. Each underlined word or word part falls directly on a beat. As you read, clap on each underlined word, keeping the rhythm steady. Be careful not to read too fast! This is a rehearsal technique and readers will not clap throughout these sections during performance. After you have established the beat, it is time to start interpreting, experimenting, and having fun with the words by varying tempo, volume, inflection, and expression.

ALL: At (insert your school name) school, just before

Christmas break,

ALL GIRLS: No <u>snow</u> was <u>falling</u>, not <u>even</u> a <u>flake</u>,

But we were all ready for winter vacation

ALL BOYS: <u>Happy</u>, excited, and <u>fill</u>ed with e<u>lation!</u>

ALL: <u>Christmas is coming!</u> We can <u>hardly wait</u>.

It <u>comes</u> once a <u>year</u> on the <u>very</u> same <u>date</u>.

But could <u>San</u>ta come <u>early</u> and <u>break</u> that <u>rule</u>?

READER 1: Well, he <u>did</u> one <u>year</u>. He came to...

ALL: (insert your school name) school!

ALL GIRLS: <u>Lit</u>tle did we <u>know</u>, when we <u>went</u> home that <u>day</u>,

Santa was already well on his way.

ALL BOYS: Good old Santa, so red, round, and burly

Had decided to visit (insert your school name) school

early.

ALL: <u>Christmas is coming!</u> We can <u>hardly wait</u>.

It <u>comes</u> once a <u>year</u> on the <u>very</u> same <u>date</u>.

But could <u>Santa</u> come <u>early</u> and <u>break</u> that <u>rule</u>?

READER 2: Well, he <u>did</u> one <u>year</u>. He came to...

ALL: (insert your school name) school!

ALL GIRLS: That night, while we were safely in bed,

Santa <u>flew</u> to *(insert your town/city name)* and

cruised overhead.

ALL BOYS: He knew he was early, didn't want to be caught,

So he <u>quietly parked</u> in our <u>school</u>'s parking <u>lot</u>.

ALL: <u>Christmas is coming!</u> We can <u>hardly wait</u>.

It <u>comes</u> once a <u>year</u> on the <u>very</u> same <u>date</u>.

But could <u>San</u>ta come <u>early</u> and <u>break</u> that <u>rule</u>?

READER 3: Well, he <u>did</u> one <u>year</u>. He came to...

ALL: (insert your school name) school!

ALL GIRLS: He couldn't find the chimney, so this old practitioner

Looked for a way in through the school air

conditioner.

ALL BOYS: When that didn't work, he carried his sack

Around to a small unlocked door in the back.

ALL: <u>Christmas is coming!</u> We can <u>hardly wait</u>.

It <u>comes</u> once a <u>year</u> on the <u>very</u> same <u>date</u>.

But could <u>San</u>ta come <u>early</u> and <u>break</u> that <u>rule</u>?

READER 4: Well, he <u>did</u> one <u>year</u>. He came to...

ALL: (insert your school name) school!

ALL GIRLS: The <u>elf</u> had come <u>early</u>, to <u>thank</u> the adults

For <u>tire</u>less <u>ser</u>vice and <u>ster</u>ling re<u>sults</u>.

ALL BOYS: The <u>teach</u>ers, the <u>staff</u>, the <u>school</u> secre<u>tary</u>,

De<u>served</u> a <u>gift</u> and de<u>served</u> to be <u>merry</u>.

ALL GIRLS: And <u>he</u> had to <u>thank</u> them be<u>fore</u> they left <u>school</u>.

Before they went off on break for the Yule.

ALL BOYS: Before all the grown-ups went home to rest,

He wanted to thank them for doing their best.

ALL: <u>Christmas is coming!</u> We can <u>hardly wait</u>.

(Be creative! Go wild with these gift names)...

READER 7: It was (insert an extraordinary gift name) and too

large to carry.

READER 8: For our <u>teacher</u>, (insert your teacher's name), he left

something unique.

(*Optional*. If you want to include all the teachers in the school, you can substitute the above line with the following. READER 8: For <u>every teacher</u>, he left <u>something unique</u>).

READER 9: It was, (insert a unique gift name), and <u>re</u>ally quite <u>chic</u>.

READER 10: For our <u>secre</u>tary, (insert your secretary's name), he <u>left</u> something <u>nice</u>.

READER 11: It was (insert a very nice gift name) and worth twice the price.

READER 12: For our <u>librarian</u>, (insert your librarian's name), he <u>left</u> something <u>sweet</u>.

READER 13: It was (insert a very sweet gift name), and really a treat.

ALL GIRLS: And for <u>all</u> of the <u>staff</u>, he left <u>plenty</u> of <u>cash</u>,

ALL BOYS: With the <u>hope</u> it might <u>fi</u>nance a <u>wild</u> Christmas <u>bash</u>!

ALL: <u>Chris</u>tmas is <u>coming!</u> We can <u>hard</u>ly <u>wait</u>.

It <u>comes</u> once a <u>year</u> on the <u>very</u> same <u>date</u>.

But could <u>San</u>ta come <u>early</u> and <u>break</u> that <u>rule</u>?

READER 14: Well, he <u>did</u> one <u>year</u>. He came to...

ALL: (insert your school name) school!

READER 15: "The <u>adults</u> at this <u>school</u> sure <u>go</u> through a <u>lot</u>.

They are caring and kind, devoted and true,

And there's very little they wouldn't do

To teach and support, keep each child in line,

Encourage and nurture, help every child shine.

So when these children are finally grown,

They'll be ready to stand on their own.
