opposite side of the stage. Reader 2 carries a large sign that says: "The DON'T TEAM!")

READER 2: What was that racket I just heard? Sounds like somebody stepped on my cat's tail!

(Reader 2 hangs sign over his/her music stand so it can be clearly seen by audience. Reader 1 stops singing, abruptly and Reader 2 gives him/her a dirty look. Reader 2 then addresses the audience).

READER 2: Hi everybody! Am I in the right place? I was told to put my sign-up table right down the hall from Mr/Mrs (principal's name) office at recess time, so this must be right. I guess you're all waiting to sign up for the DON'T TEAM. I need lots of people to sign up for the DON'T TEAM! You all look perfect. Don't leave. I'll be right back with a pencil.

(Reader 2 turns BTA as Reader 1 quietly picks up scroll of paper from prop table and turns to face the audience).

READER 1: Hope I've got enough paper for all the names.

(Reader 1 holds on to top of paper and lets the scroll go. The paper unrolls all the way down the front of the music stand and reaches the floor below. Reader 1 looks down).

READER 1: Yeah, that should do it. (Clears throat, then speaks loudly): A-hem! Ladies and gentlemen! Attention please. Calling all

GOOD PEOPLE! Hey, hey, I'm right over here. It's time for all GOOD PEOPLE to sign-up for the DO TEAM!

(Reader 2 turns to face the audience holding a large pencil).

READER 2: Good people? What are you talking about?

READER 1: Excuse me, but I'm here on official business. Mr/Mrs (teacher's name) told me to find a lot of GOOD PEOPLE and sign them up for the DO TEAM. What are *YOU* doing here?

PUPPER 2: Ha! Well excuse *me*, but I'm here on official business too. Mr/Mrs (another teacher's name) told me to set up a table and ask people to sign up for the DON'T TEAM.

READER 1: (To audience). Oh, oh, another team! I'd better get to work. I'll get my sign-up sheet filled with names before this so-called DON'T TEAM even gets started. I was here first and the early bird gets the worm, ya know.

(Loudly): Step right up! Calling all GOOD PEOPLE! I'm looking for GOOD PEOPLE to sign-up for the DO TEAM!

READER 2: So, what's this "good people" stuff? What exactly does that mean?

READER 1: GOOD PEOPLE are honest people! Here, I'll show you.

(Reader 1 turns BTA. Reader 2 drops pencil on music stand and speaks).

READER 2: Hey! What's going on here? (To audience): Where's he/she going?

(Reader 1 quickly turns back to face audience holding another sign that says):

HONESTY

READER 1: This says it all. Good people...

Tell the truth.

They tell all the truth.

They say what they mean.

They keep their promises.

And, if they find something, they return it to the owner!

So, that's what good people do and that's why I want to sign them up for the DO TEAM!

(Reader 1 drops sign to the floor).

READER 2: No, no. You've got it all wrong. GOOD PEOPLE belong on the DON'T TEAM.

Reader 2 turns to prop table and quickly produces another sign that says:

TRUSTWORTHY

READER 2: This is the sign that says it all. Good people are trustworthy. They...

Don't tell lies.

Don't trick other people by telling only part of the truth.

Don't say they'll do something without really doing it.

Don't cheat and don't steal!

(Reader 2 drops sign to the floor).

READER 1: Hummmm. (To audience): It sounds like I've got some competition here. I want the DO TEAM to win by getting the most sign-ups, but this guy (girl) is invading my territory. I'd better think of a way to get my sign-ups done fast. I need to attract some attention!

(Reader 1 turns BTA).

READER 2: Oh, oh! Now what's he/she doing? I don't want to get behind in the sign-up department. I need to attract some attention too. I'd better think of something! (Reader 2 turns BTA as Reader 1 again turns to face audience. Reader 1 holds a blue and white crepe paper pom-pom and shakes it wildly. The crepe paper ribbons flip back and forth over the puppet's head).

READER 1: These are the DO TEAM colors!

(Reader 1 begins to loudly cheer).

Blue and white is always right, Do Team, fight, fight!

(To audience): Let's hear it everyone! Help me with another cheer...

Give me a "D"

(Audience): "D"

READER 1: Give me an "O"

(Audience): "O"

READER 1: What does it spell?

(Audience): DO!

READER 1: Say it again...

(Audience): DO!

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Blue and white is always true, DO TEAM, we fight for you!

(Reader 1 looks to the left, then to the right, then out to the audience).

READER 1: Oops, guess that didn't work. I don't see anybody coming to sign up. I'd better try something different.

Attention, attention! Come one, come all. Sign up for the DO TEAM. I'm looking for teammates with...

(Reader 1 turns to the prop table, drops pom-pom, and turns back holding a sign that says:

INTEGRITY

(Reader 2 turns head to have a look at sign, then slowly turns all the way around to face the audience).

READER 2: Integrity? So what's that supposed to mean?

READER 1: I'm looking for good people with integrity! People with integrity are...

Brave - because they're always trying to do and say the right things.

And they are strong. They try to do the right thing, even when people want them to do bad things. I'm looking for people who try to be good - all the time!

That's what they *do* and that's why they should sign up for the DO TEAM.

READER 2: Oh boy, how wrong can a person be? I'm sorry, but you really do not have a clue about how things work. People with integrity belong on the DON'T TEAM because they...

Don't do bad things, even when people try to make them do bad things. And they don't say bad things, even if it means they'll lose friends or fun or even money.

So there!

(Reader 2 turns BTA).

READER 1: (To audience). This is going from bad to worse! That guy (girl) is stuck in DON'T-VILLE!

(Reader 1 turns BTA and puts sign back on prop table as Reader 2 turns to face audience wearing a very large baseball cap with a sign attached that says: DON'T! He (she) struggles to see the audience from under the heavy brim, then pushes the cap up so he/she can see. He/she also carries a sign that says):
