An Early Visit From Santa Claus

NOTE: This script is formatted for a number of SOLO READERS and ALL. The script is very flexible and allows a director to use as few or as many readers as required by dividing the reading parts between all available readers. If the reading group is very small, double up on solo reader parts. If the reading group is very large, you can assign different readers to all the solo readers parts below.

ESTABLISHING THE RHYTHM

To find the proper rhythm for this choral piece, first read-aloud and clap through the sections as you go. Each underlined word or word part falls directly on a beat. As you read, clap on each underlined word, keeping the rhythm steady. Be careful not to read too fast! This is a rehearsal technique and readers will not clap throughout these sections during performance. After you have established the beat, it is time to start interpreting, experimenting, and having fun with the words by varying tempo, volume, inflection, and expression.

ALL: At (insert your school name) school, just before

Christmas break,

READER 1: No <u>snow</u> was <u>falling</u>, not <u>even</u> a <u>flake</u>,

But we were all ready for winter vacation

Happy, excited, and filled with elation!

ALL: Christmas is coming! We can hardly wait.

He <u>want</u>ed to <u>thank</u> them for <u>doing</u> their <u>best</u>.

the following. READER 8: For <u>every teacher</u>, he left <u>something unique</u>).

READER It was, (insert a unique gift name), and <u>re</u>ally quite

chic.

READER For our <u>secre</u>tary, (insert your secretary's name), he

<u>left</u> something <u>nice</u>.

READER It was (insert a very nice gift name) and worth twice

the price.

READER For our librarian, (insert your librarian's name), he

left something sweet.

READER It was (insert a very sweet gift name), and really a

treat.

READER And for <u>all</u> of the <u>staff</u>, he left <u>plenty</u> of <u>cash</u>,

With the <u>hope</u> it might <u>fi</u>nance a <u>wild</u> Christmas

bash!
