FORMATTING

This story-poem script is formatted for 8 to 40 solo reading parts and occasional lines where all readers speak together. The script may be performed with just 8 readers. However, if you want to involve more readers, simply add them as needed. No reader numbers have been assigned after the first verse below. This is done so that a teacher/director may use a flexible number of readers during performance.

ESTABLISHING THE RHYTHM

To find the proper rhythm for this story-poem piece, first read-aloud and clap through the sections as you go. Each underlined word or word part falls directly on a beat. As you read, clap on each underlined word, keeping the rhythm steady. Be careful not to read too fast! This is a rehearsal technique and readers will not clap throughout these sections during performance. Once the rhythm has been established, you'll want to work at smoothing the piece out and making it flow.

VERSE ONE

READER 1: I'm a star! (pause)

READER 2: Up in the sky. (pause)

READER 3: A light supply. (pause)

ALL: Don't ask me how,

I don't know why,

I can't reply!

READER 4: All I know is, I'm a plasma ball,

And I hang with other stars, big and small.

ALL: Our job is to shine - one and all.

READER 5: And once, I shone the brightest, I recall.

READER 6: Thinking back, I remember being filled with pride

When years ago, I was asked to be a guide.

READER 7: I know that job doesn't sound distinguished,

But because my light was bright and wasn't extinguished,

READER 8: I lit the way for a miracle on earth

ALL: To a stable, and a manger, and a little
baby's birth.

VERSE TWO

READER: I'm a star! (pause)

READER: A light on high. (pause)

READER: To travel by. (pause)

ALL: Don't ask me how,

I don't know why,

I can't reply.

READER: But I'll speak about the shepherds who
had settled down to sleep

When an angel appeared and woke more
than the sheep. She said,

READER/ANGEL: "No snoozing! I've come with joyful
news!

The son of God is born today. Be off –
no time to lose!"

READER: Then I led those shepherds to the place
where Jesus lay,

READER: And they knelt down on their knees to
sing and pray.

ALL: The other stars above, danced and
swirled

To celebrate Jesus, the Savior of the
world.

READER: But I stayed still during all that mirth
To shine my light on a little baby's birth.

VERSE THREE

READER: I'm a star! (pause)

READER: A watchful eye. (pause)

READER: You can't deny. (pause)

ALL: Don't ask me how,

I don't know why,

I can't reply.

READER: In the East Wise Men saw my light

And they knew a great ruler had been
born that night.

READER: So they went to Jerusalem, to Herod the king

Where they sought his palace, each section and wing,

READER: And asked to see the new King of the Jews!

Herod was troubled, this was not good news.

READER: Of this new king there was little known.

Herod was afraid he might lose his throne.

He said,

READER/HEROD: “Follow that star with the bright, bright glow.

When you find that baby, I want to know!”

VERSE FOUR

READER: I’m a star! (pause)

READER: How high I fly (pause)

READER: In heaven’s sky. (pause)
