READERS 1,2,3,5:	"Oh no! The sun is gone,"
READER 5:	The bright, shiny sun had disappeared before their eyes.
READER 1:	The Shao people held tight to each other and helped each other find their way home.
READER 2:	Fortunately, the moon came out at night.
READER 3:	Everyone could see again in the moonlight and was able to do some work.
READER 4:	Suddenly, another huge sound was heard.
ALL:	"Boom!"
READER 5:	The houses shook and were almost knocked down by this huge sound. The people cried:
READERS 1,2,3,4:	"Oh no! The moon is also gone. What are we going to do?".
READER 1:	Everyone was frightened.
READER 2:	No one knew what had caused this incident.

READER 2:	The animals seemed lifeless.
READER 3:	Without sunlight, nothing no crops grew. And the people cried:
READERS 1,2,3,5:	"How can we live a life without sunlight?"
READER 4:	DaJianGe and ShuiSheJie, A young couple, depended on growing corn for a living.
READER 5:	Since the sun had disappeared, the crops had wilted and the corn did not have golden kernels anymore. One day, ShuiSheJie told her husband,

READER 5:	Suddenly the young couple realized they were in an underground kitchen. They saw an old white haired woman stood cooking in the kitchen.
