Cast: 7 Readers, Including Seven Character Voices.

**READER 6:** Once, a King Mouse and a Queen Mouse lived in the walls of an \_(city). The king and old stone temple in \_\_\_\_\_ queen had one daughter whom they called "Mouse Princess" and they were very proud of her. To them, she was the most beautiful, most intelligent, and most talented mouse daughter in the world. **READER 5:** Now, when the Rat Princess became old enough to marry, the king and gueen were determined to help her find a husband who was worthy. No everyday mouse would do! The king and queen decided that their daughter should marry only the most powerful in all the world. But the queen said, 2/QUEEN: "Who IS the most powerful in all the world?" READER 3: And the king said, 1/KING: "I will ask the old wise mouse who lives under the \_\_\_\_\_tree! Surely he will know who is the most powerful in all the world." **READER 4:** But the old wise rat wasn't sure about the answer to that question. He considered many possibilities. Finally he made a suggestion. 7/OLD RAT: "Yes, I believe the most powerful in the world is the sun which shines in the sky. For without the sun, the rice would not grow in the rice paddies. Yes, yes! The most powerful in the world must be the sun."

**1/KING:** "Then it's to the sun I must travel!"

**READER 6:** And the king started off on his travels! He traveled across

the top of the highest peak in the \_\_\_\_\_ Mountains, and

there he decided to STOP!

**READER 5:** From the top of the mountain, the King Mouse jumped upon

one of the sun's rays and scurried along the ray until he found

himself face to face with the mighty sun.

**READER 5:** The king bowed low and waited for the sun to speak first.

Finally, the sun said,

**3/SUN:** "What do you want, little brother?"

**1/KING:** "I have come to offer you the hand of my daughter, the Mouse

Princess, in marriage - oh sun - for you are the most powerful in

all the world and no one else will do!"

**READER 5:** The sun laughed!

**3/SUN:** "If it is the most powerful you seek, I will not do at all. The

cloud is more powerful than I, for when he floats in front of me,

he blocks my rays from reaching the rice paddies. Yes, if it is

the most powerful you seek, you must find the cloud!"

1/KING: "Then you will NOT DO AT ALL! It's to the cloud I must travel."

**READER 7:** And he began to travel! He traveled across the face of the sun,

out along another of the sun's rays, until he reached the very tip

and there he decided to STOP!

**READER 2:** The king bowed low and waited for the cloud to speak first.

**4/CLOUD:** "What do you want, little brother?"

in all the world and no one else will do!"

**READER 3:** The cloud giggled!

**4/CLOUD:** "If it is the most powerful you seek, I will not do at all. The wind

seek, you must find the wind!"

1/KING: "Then you will NOT do at all! It's to the wind I must travel."

**READER 2:** And he began to travel! He ran around the face of the cloud.

where the wind lives, and there the king decided to STOP!

**READER 3:** The King Mouse saw the wind rushing past them at an

impossibly high speed. But the king was determined! He

jumped upon the back of the speeding wind. Then, he scurried to the front of the racing wind, bent down, and looked the wind

right in the eye.
