BLOCK ACTORS IN FRONT OF SEATED READERS, FACING AUDIENCE. YOU WILL NEED CARDBOARD KIMONOS WHICH HAVE BEEN COLORED BY THE CHILDREN. CUT LARGE HOLE IN TOP OF EACH KIMONO AND ASK ACTORS TO STRING KIMONOS ON A BLUE CARDBOARD TUBE "POLE" AS THE ACTION PROGRESSES).
