## **A Valentine Rhyme: Take Five**

## **ADDING MORE READERS**

You will notice the script is numbered for 5 Solo Readers, a few All Lines and an ALL CHORUS. After the first 5 solo reading lines, the parts are not numbered. This is done so you may easily pencil in as many solo readers as you'd like. You can include 10, 15, 20, or 25 individual solo readers if you wish. However, if you want to use only the original 5 solo readers, please divide the remaining lines up between them as indicated below.

## **ESTABLISHING THE RHYTHM**

To find the proper rhythm, first read-aloud and clap through the text as you go. Each underlined word or word part falls directly on a beat. As you read, clap on each underlined word, keeping the rhythm steady. Be careful not to read too fast! This is a rehearsal technique and readers will not clap throughout these sections during performance.

#### **ALL CHORUS**

The chorus for this script was inspired by a Valentine song found on the Internet. I have written my own version, but here is the original information:

This might be a great idea for the ALL CHORUS below. Selected readers might hold up large drawings: sunshine, star, jelly jar, rainbow, apple, and music note to correspond with the chorus words.

## **VERSE 1**

SOLO READER 1: <u>Five</u> fancy <u>Val</u>entines,

(All readers and chorus members hold a hand up in the air showing one finger, then two fingers, then three, four, and five as the following is read):

ALL: One, two, three, four, five.

(Hands down).

ALL CHORUS: You're my sunshine, you're my star,

You're my favorite jelly jar.

You're my rainbow in the sky,

You're the apple of my eye.

You're the song I love to sing.

I would you give anything.

SOLO READER 5: <u>Val</u>entine, will <u>you</u> be mine?

If so, here comes the second rhyme.

VERSE 2

SOLO READER <u>Five</u> funny <u>Val</u>entines,

Each one cost a nickel.

SOLO READER Sure to get a laugh or two,

Guaranteed a giggle.

SOLO READER Yesterday FedEx arrived

And took all five away.

SOLO READER Soon they'll be on your doorstep

READERS On <u>Val</u>entine's <u>Day!</u>

(Same movements as above).

ALL: One, two, three, four, five.

(Hands down).

If so, here comes rhyme number three.

SOLO READER <u>Five</u> frilly <u>Val</u>entines

Costing each a dime.

SOLO READER <u>Lace</u> and heart-shaped <u>flow</u>ers

Ask will you be mine this time?

SOLO READER Then <u>yester</u>day a <u>truck</u> pulled up

And took all five away.

SOLO READER You'll <u>find</u> them at the <u>front</u> door

SOLO READER <u>Val</u>entine, yes <u>there</u> is more.

Get ready. Here comes number four.

**VERSE 4** 

SOLO READER <u>Five</u> fantastic <u>Val</u>entines

Costing each a quarter.

SOLO READER I signed them all with love

Because I <u>am</u> your best supporter.

SOLO READER Then <u>yester</u>day I <u>hid</u> them.

I took all five away.
