A Fairy Tale Based on "The Gingerbread Man"
Adapted and Formatted for Readers Theater by Lois Walker

Cast: 1 Narrator and 10 Child Reader Parts, Including Character Parts

NARRATOR: Once upon a time an old sorcerer decided to work some kitchen magic. He said,

ALL: "Hey! Hey! My belly and soul

Are hungry for a fresh

SPRING ROLL!

NARRATOR: The old sorcerer placed his magic hat upon the kitchen counter. Into the hat he threw:

CHILD 1: Spring roll wrappers,

CHILD 2: Shredded carrots and cabbage,

CHILD 3: Green onions, sausage, chicken, and rice.

CHILD 4: Rice is always nice!

NARRATOR: Next the old sorcerer searched through his kitchen cupboards and found his favorite secret ingredients.

They were:

CHILD 5: Garlic and ground peanuts!

NARRATOR: He threw these into the hat too. Finally the old sorcerer picked up his magic wand, waved it grandly over the magic hat, and chanted again,

ALL: "Hey! Hey! My belly and soul

Are hungry for a fresh

SPRING ROLL!

NARRATOR: All at once there was a mixing and a mashing, a twirling and a thrashing. The magic hat disappeared in a puff of smoke and reappeared inside the old sorcerer's oven. Two seconds later, the oven door popped open and a fresh giant spring roll jumped out of the hat.

CHILD 6: It didn't even stop to say hello.

CHILD 7: It rolled across the kitchen floor and out the door before the old sorcerer could say,

ALL: "HEY! HEY!"

NARRATOR: The old sorcerer ran after it. He wanted to eat that spring roll! But the spring roll just laughed and called out,

ALL: "Na Na Na-na-na

Can't catch me!"

You can run until you drop

Or run until I holler...

(Pause)

ALL: STOP!"

NARRATOR: And at the sound of the word *stop*, the poor sorcerer froze still as a stone and cried,

SOCERER/8: "HEY! HEY!
I WANT TO GO HOME"

CHILD 9: But the sorcerer had outsmarted himself with his very own magic.

CHILD 10: He couldn't move a muscle!

NARRATOR: And the roly poly sorcerer's spring roll ran merrily on its way. The spring roll ran past a sleepy cow who was happily grazing beside the road. When the cow saw that spring roll, she said,

ALL: "Moo! Moo! My belly and soul

Are hungry for a fresh

SPRING ROLL!"

NARRATOR: But the spring roll just laughed and called out,

ALL: "Na Na Na-na-na

Can't catch me!"

You can run until you drop

Or run until I holler...

(Pause)

ALL: STOP!"

NARRATOR: And at the sound of the word *stop*, the poor old cow froze still as a stone and cried,

COW (CHILD 1): "MOO! MOO!
I WANT TO GO HOME."

CHILD 2: But the cow couldn't move a muscle.

NARRATOR: And the roly poly sorcerer's spring roll ran merrily on its way. The spring roll ran past a duck who was wading in a puddle. When the duck saw the spring roll, he said,

**ALL: "Quack! Quack! My belly and soul
Are hungry for a fresh
SPRING ROLL!"**

NARRATOR: But the spring roll just laughed and called out,

**ALL: "Na Na Na-na-na
Can't catch me!
You can run until you drop
Or run until I holler...**

(Pause)

ALL: STOP!"

NARRATOR: And at the sound of the word *stop*. The poor old duck froze still as a stone and cried,

DUCK (CHILD 3): "QUACK! QUACK!

I WANT TO GO HOME."

CHILD 4: But the duck couldn't move a muscle.

NARRATOR: And the roly poly sorcerer's spring roll ran merrily on its way. The spring roll ran past a sheep who was frolicking in the meadow. When the sheep saw the spring roll, she said,

**ALL: "Bah! Bah! My belly and soul

**ALL: "Na Na Na-na-na

Can't catch me!

You can run until you drop

Or run until I holler...**

(Pause)

STOP!"
